OPERA

MESE MARIANO / LE VILLI

The 2013 Festival presents a double-bill of one-act operas by two important Italian composers, a pair of rarely performed, emotionally rich works steeped in the anguish of a woman's love. In Giordano's *Mese Mariano*, Carmela longs to see the son she gave up to an orphanage in her youth. Puccini's first opera, *Le villi*, is the tale of a man who abandons his lover for the riches of the city only to be tormented by the scorned woman's vengeful spirit after her death. Directed by Stefano Vizioli, and conducted by Maurizio Barbacini. Sung in Italian with English supertitles.

MATSUKAZE

With a hypnotic tapestry of sound, Toshio Hosokawa—one of Japan's most prominent living composers—conjures up the spirit world of the Noh play on which his ethereal new opera is based. Directed by acclaimed Chinese director Chen Shi-Zheng, who was responsible for the Festival productions of *The Peony Pavilion* and *Monkey: Journey to the West*, and conducted by Resident Conductor John Kennedy. Sung in German with English supertitles.

DANCE

COMPAGNIE KÄFIG

Inspired by an encounter with 11 young dancers from the shantytowns of Brazil, *Correria* and *Agwa* are two heart-stopping works that showcase a sensational combination of athletic samba, hip-hop, and capoeira dance styles.

BALLET FLAMENCO DE ANDALUCÍA

Under the direction of Ruben Olmo, one of flamenco's brightest contemporary stars, the exquisite dancers of Spain's renowned Ballet Flamenco de Andalucía take the stage in a blaze of castanets, fans, and traditional "bata de cola" dresses.

SHANTALA SHIVALINGAPPA

After her triumphant Spoleto debut in 2008, Shantala returns to the Festival accompanied by four classical Indian musicians in a spellbinding performance of dramatic contrasts and breathtaking virtuosity.

LUCKY PLUSH PRODUCTIONS

This dance-theater production spins off *Gaslight*, the 1944 film noir classic in which a woman is slowly driven mad by her conniving husband. *The Better Half* playfully captures the habitual patterns, escapist tendencies, and resilience in contemporary relationships.

JARED GRIMES

Emerging tap phenom Jared Grimes, who has danced alongside such legends as Gregory Hines and Ben Vereen, has exploded onto the contemporary dance scene with a unique hybrid of tap, hip-hop, and street jazz.

THEATER

A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM

Having last worked together on the powerful Tony Award-winning production of *War Horse*, Bristol Old Vic and South Africa's Handspring Puppet Company turn their innovative artistry to Shakespeare's enduring comedy. Making its U.S. debut at the 2013 Festival, this highly anticipated production promises to be a truly magical theatrical event.

MAYDAY MAYDAY

Tristan Sturrock was last seen at the 2006 Festival in Kneehigh Theatre's popular *Tristan & Yseult*. Few were aware that two years prior Sturrock had suffered an injury that threatened to end his career and change his life forever. Using illusion, music, and physical comedy, Sturrock tells his extraordinary autobiographical story, a tale that is as achingly poignant as it is brutally funny.

BULLET CATCH

Writer and performer Rob Drummond, in his alter ego of William Wonder, explores the history of the Bullet Catch, a stunt so dangerous Houdinin refused to even attempt it. The audience is led through a darkly humorous and engaging theatrical magic show featuring levitation, games of chance, and—for those who dare stay to the very end—the most notorious finale in show business.

OEDIPIUS

The citizens of Thebes are in the grasp of devastation, famine, and plague; Oedipus the King will not rest until he has lifted the curse. Celebrated actor and director Steven Berkoff and the Nottingham Playhouse brings their distinctive physical style to this adaptation of Sophocles' classic Greek tragedy, *Oedipus Rex*.

THE INTERGALACTIC NEMESIS

With more than 1,250 original full-color comic-book images blasting from a two-story-high projection screen, three actors voicing dozens of colorful characters, a Foley artist creating a plethora of unbelievable sound effects, and a keyboardist accenting every move with an original score, *The Intergalactic Nemesis* is a spectacle unlike any other and a show for the kid in everyone.

PHYSICAL THEATER

LE GRAND C

Recalling recent Festival favorites *Circa* and *Traces*, Compagnie XY make their Spoleto Festival USA debut with *Le Grand C*, a quintessentially French circus spectacle of heart-stopping stunts, stunning skill, and distinctive style.

BANK OF AMERICA CHAMBER MUSIC

The heart and soul of the Festival, the twice daily Chamber Music concerts feature a changing roster of artists in 11 distinctive programs led by violinist Geoff Nuttall and performed in the historic Dock Street Theatre.

After 30 years of dedicated artistic leadership, Joseph Flummerfelt makes his farewell appearance as Spoleto's Artistic Director for Choral Activities in perhaps the most moving and memorable concert of the Festival season.

Led by renowned conductor Stefan Asbury, a regular with the world's leading orchestras and Chief Conductor of the Noord Nederlands Orkest, the Spoleto Festival USA Orchestra presents a dazzling trio of orchestral showpieces.

ADAMS/*HARMONIELEHRE* RAVEL/*BOULEZ* / *FRONTISPICE* VASKS/*CREDO*

The Spoleto Festival USA Orchestra, led by Resident Conductor John Kennedy, will bring John Adams' mighty *Harmonielehre* to life in a remarkable program that also includes the American premieres of the Ravel/Boulez *Frontispice* and Pēteris Vasks' *Credo* (2009), a passionate response to the world's ecological issues.

WESTMINSTER CHOIR CONCERTS

Few Festival traditions are as treasured as the Westminster Choir concerts at the Cathedral Church of St. Luke and St. Paul. In this inspirational and idyllic setting, the pristine voices of the Festival's acclaimed choir-in-residence soar to unimaginable heights.

JOHNNYSWIM

Though he'd given up on a career in music, Abner Ramirez had kept on writing and performing songs. When he met Amanda Sudano, the two began writing together, drawing from any corner of popular music that pleased them, from folk and soul to indie-pop and R&B. No matter the story of a song or its musical influence, each tune burns with a spirit and passion that has this singer/songwriter team turning heads in the music world.

ANGELIQUE KIDJO

The universal ability to communicate in music has been clear to Grammy winner Angélique Kidjo from her youth, and remains so as she has become one of today's most celebrated artists. Sounds from Nigeria, Ghana, Congo, Senegal, and her native Benin are nuanced with influences from James Brown and Curtis Mayfield to the Rolling Stones.

ROSANNE CASH

Rosanne Cash inherited a reverence for song and depth of artistry, and an equal duty to find insights of her own. She has answered this calling with a three-decade career marked by emotional honesty and creative growth. With a sound that blurs the lines between country, rock, roots, and pop, Cash returns to Spoleto Festival USA in a special one-night-only performance.

J.D. McPHERSON

"Tom Waits, Nick Lowe and John Prine are huge fans of his," writes *The Guardian* about J.D. McPherson, "you should know this from the start." Hailing from Broken Arrow, Oklahoma, the former art teacher and punk rocker uses his soulful voice and talent for writing to create music that is both classic and forward thinking.

WELLS FARGO JAZZ

GREGORY PORTER

Grammy-nominated jazz and soul singer Gregory Porter brings to his music a haunting and powerful baritone sound, as well as the sensibility of a talented lyricist and composer.

ANDRÉ MEHMARI

By incorporating the rhythms of his native Brazil as a keyboard virtuoso and skilled composer, André Mehmari roams from the tender and romantic to the hard-driving and dramatic, speaking clearly and profoundly in a luminous instrumental voice.

IIRO RANTALA

A fluent jazz improviser, poetic composer, and virtuosic classical pianist all wrapped into one. Performing a delightfully diverse repertoire, from improvisations on Bach's *Goldberg Variations* to his own crystalline compositions, Finland's Iiro Rantala offers an evening of music not to be missed.

PUNCH BROTHERS

Mandolinist Chris Thile, guitarist Chris Eldridge, bassist Paul Kowert, banjo player Noam Pikelny and violinist Gabe Witcher are Punch Brothers—a virtuosic and freewheeling quintet who make their long-awaited return to the Festival after their sold-out 2008 Spoleto debut.

ALESSANDRO PENEZZI & ALEXANDRE RIBEIRO

Brazilian guitarist extraordinaire Alessandro Penezzi made his first Festival appearance in a rousing 2010 performance with clarinetist Nailor "Proveta" Azevedo. He now returns with Proveta's exceptional young protégé, clarinetist Alexandre Ribeiro, for intimate duo concerts at the Simons Center.

ELI DEGIBRI

Eli Degibri's ability to tell a story with his saxophone has earned him a place on the stage next to some of jazz's leading figures. An active bandleader and composer, his unique songwriting has an appeal far beyond traditional jazz audiences. "Eli's music treads uncharted waters," says Herbie Hancock.

THE RED STICK RAMBLERS

Performing a unique hybrid of Cajun, honky-tonk, and swing, the Ramblers' honest and hard-driving music is inseparable from their way of life and the rich Louisiana culture that first inspired them.
