### ABOUT THE COMPANY

Nottingham Playhouse has been one of the United Kingdom's leading producing theaters since 1948. They create productions large and small-timeless classics, enthralling family shows, and adventurous new commissions, often touring work nationally and internationally. The Nottingham Playhouse Theatre Company production of Steven Berkoff's Oedipus-which they are delighted to present at the 2013 Spoleto Festival USA-transferred to the Edinburgh Festival Fringe in 2011. Berkoff's On The Waterfront traveled to the Hong Kong Arts Festival following successful runs in Nottingham, Edinburgh, and London's West End. In 2012, Nottingham Playhouse Theatre Company productions toured to 15 major cities across the United Kingdom. 2013 is a very special year for The Playhouse as it celebrates 50 years in its existing building. During those 50 years, the Playhouse stage has played host to many outstanding performers and helped create a generation of dedicated theatergoers. As well as free events and exciting activities throughout the year, The Playhouse will also stage the European premiere of Khaled Hosseini's best-selling book, The Kite Runner, which has also been adapted as a film.



GILES CROFT (artistic director) was appointed artistic director of the Gate Theatre, London, in 1985. In 1989 Croft joined the National Theatre as literary manager. He became artistic director of the Palace Theatre, Watford, in May 1995. He has been artistic director of Nottingham Playhouse Theatre Company since 1999. Croft has directed over 50 productions and,

as a playwright, his work has been produced throughout the UK and Europe.



ALISTER O'LOUGHLIN (Tiresias) trained in the United Kingdom and Eastern Europe before co-founding Prodigal Theatre with Miranda Henderson in 1999. He has appeared in every Prodigal production and is the performer/writer of the multiaward-winning *The Tragedian Trilogy*. With Prodigal's Urban Playground Team, he has helped develop performance parkour, a

fusion of contemporary urban dance with free-running. With the UPG team, he has toured across Europe, Africa, Australia, and the Middle East for clients including National Theatre and the British Council. As an actor/manager of The Nightingale Theatre, he contributed as a mentor to the development of over 100 pieces of theater and dance. O'Loughlin is currently studying dance pedagogy at Trinity Laban Conservatoire of Music & Dance. The UPG Team's new show, *Run This Town*, will be presented in London and at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe this year before touring internationally.

JONATHAN SIDGWICK (ensemble) has been directed twice before by Steven Berkoff—as Luke in *Messiah: Scenes from a Crucifixion* at Bristol Old Vic, and in *Oedipus* at the 2012 Edinburgh Festival. Other credits include Heathcliff in *Wuthering Heights* for Oxfordshire Theatre Company; John Proctor in a national tour of *The Crucible*; and most recently as Oliver Davenport

in David Edgar's *Pentacost* for Charm Offensive. Sidgwick's television work includes *Eastenders* and *Father Brown* for BBC TV; *Coronation Street* for Granada; *Hollyoaks* for Channel 4; and *Precipice* for HBO. ANITA DOBSON (Jocasta) has made many appearances in London's West End, including Budgie, Three Sisters, Le Bourgeois gentilhomme, Kvetch, My Lovely Shayna Maidel, Charley's Aunt, The Pajama Game, The Vagina Monologues, Chicago, Thoroughly Modern Millie, Hamlet, Calendar Girls, and most recently, Bette and Joan, playing the legendary Bette Davis. At the

National Theatre, Dobson starred in *Frozen*, which earned her nominations for an Olivier Award, Evening Standard Award, and London Critics' Award. She toured for a year as Dolly Levi in *Hello*, *Dolly!* and appeared in *The Silver Lake* at Wexford Festival Opera. Dobson won a whole new legion of fans following her success in *Strictly Come Dancing* on BBC and on tour. As Angie Watts in *EastEnders*, Dobson won the Pye Colour Television Award for "TV Personality of the Year," and TV Times "Actress of the Year." Dobson has made countless film and television appearances and has recently joined the cast of *The Archers* for several episodes.



MARK FROST (ensemble) spent the last 18 months on a world arena tour of *Batman Live*. STEVEN BERKOFF (author/director/ Creon) was born in Stepney, London. After studying drama and mime in London and Paris, he entered a series of repertory companies, and in 1968, formed the London Theatre Group. His plays and adaptations have been performed in many countries and in many languages. Among the many adaptations Berkoff has created for the

stage (directed and toured) are Kafka's The Metamorphosis and The Trial, Agamemnon after Aeschylus, and Poe's The Fall of the House of Usher. He has directed and toured productions of Shakespeare's Coriolanus, also playing the title role, Richard II, Hamlet, and Macbeth, as well as Oscar Wilde's Salome, seen at Spoleto Festival USA in 1990. Berkoff's original stage plays include East, West, Messiah: Scenes from a Crucifixion, The Secret Love Life of Ophelia, Decadence, Harry's Christmas, Massage, Acapulco, Brighton Beach Scumbags, and Six Actors in Search of a Director. He has performed his trilogy of solo shows, One Man, Shakespeare's Villains, and Requiem for Ground Zero in venues all over the world. He directed and co-starred with Joan Collins in the film version of his play, Decadence. He recently appeared in The Tourist with Johnny Depp and Angelina Jolie and in David Fincher's Girl with a Dragon Tattoo. Berkoff has had published a variety of books on the theater including the production journals I am Hamlet, Meditations on Metamorphosis, and Coriolanus in Deutschland. Faber has published Berkoff's collected plays in three volumes, as well as The Secret Love Life of Ophelia.

MICHAEL VALE (designer) has designed the sets and costumes for over 180 theater and opera productions both in the UK and abroad, including some he has directed. His musical output includes orchestral and choral works, music for theater, contemporary dance, and (occasionally) fanfares for royalty. He composed and designed sound for Steven Berkoff's Biblical Tales with New End Theatre, Hampstead.
