Video Technicians (VT) are responsible for implementing venue video systems as created by the Festival Video Engineer (FV) across festival venues. VT's work alongside the FV and Assistant Festival Video (AFV) to load-in video equipment into all venues with the help of venue crews. Some festival venues will both produce original work and present existing work while other venues will only present. The VT's responsibilities and interaction with produced works do not vary from that of presented work. Every festival venue, in some capacity, will either rep between simultaneous shows or change between multiple shows over the course of the festival. Not every venue will necessarily have video needs and the day to day needs for the VT will vary based on the show needs.

The VT reports directly to the Venue Manager (VM) when in a venue. The VM helps to coalesce the information from every department and manage the venue schedule efficiently. When not working directly in a festival venue, the VT reports to the FV and supports other festival video needs.

Responsibilities

- Review and understand the plots and schematics for all shows that require video. Refer to FV with any questions.
- Review and understand all venues with shows that require video.
- Assist FV and AFV with system installations in each venue as needed.
- Depending on the needs of shows, the VT may be asked to program video systems, run cameras, or act as a board operator for different shows in different venues.

Requirements

- Proficient in video systems, including projector setup and focus, lensing, cameras, and common video software (Watchout, Isadora, D3, etc.)
- Ability to manage several projects simultaneously.
- Strong communication and interpersonal skills with an emphasis on the ability to synthesize information clearly and in a timely fashion.
- Ability to work long days, nights, and weekends with a positive attitude.
- Must be comfortable and able to work in the following conditions: low light or no light environments, catwalks, climbing ladders, confined spaces, standing for long periods of time.
