For 17 days each spring, Charleston transforms. Our city becomes not just a stage, but a living canvas where stories are retold and reimagined. In *Remember This*, the life and legacy of Jan Karski brought the enormity of World War II into sharp human focus. Etienne Charles traced the Afro-Caribbean roots of jazz and the Gullah Geechee tradition in *Gullah Roots*, connecting cultures and generations in sound. And in the world premiere of Alisa Weilerstein's *FRAGMENTS*, Bach's cello suites intertwined with contemporary voices, dissolving boundaries between past and present.

Our 49th Festival presented unforgettable performances spanning opera, theater, music, and dance, including impressive premieres that pushed artistic boundaries. The vibrant tapestry of performances was woven by an exceptional group of artists, unequivocally cementing Spoleto Festival USA's esteemed position as a preeminent global cultural event.

MARQUEE PROGRAMS

- The sold-out world premiere production of Benjamin Britten's *The Turn of the Screw*, directed by Rodula Gaitanou, captivated critics.
- Spoleto's world premiere production of Jules Massenet's opera *Thaïs* was a resounding success, thrilling audiences for two nights at the Charleston Gaillard Center.
- Cellist Alisa Weilerstein fully realized her ambitious
 FRAGMENTS, completing its world premiere run with six solo recitals at the College of Charleston's Sottile Theatre.
- Manual Cinema's world premiere of The 4th Witch, a Spoleto commission, engrossed audiences across six

- performances at the College of Charleston's Emmett Robinson Theatre.
- Gravity & Other Myths, the hailed Australian circus troupe, made a triumphant return to the Festival with the U.S. premiere of *Ten Thousand Hours* at Festival Hall.
- The U.S. premiere of **White Box** was an inspired multimedia performance blending dance, music, film, and projection.
- Kronos Quartet made a heralded Festival debut including the world premiere of "Mende Funeral Suite," a new piece by Charleston bandleader Charlton Singleton performed with drummer Quentin E. Baxter.

Our Community



Each year, Spoleto's commitment to community goes beyond concert halls and theaters to serve as a catalyst for cultural change through education and community engagement initiatives in Charleston.

- Open Stage Door offers free tickets to social-service organizations based in the metro Charleston area.
 In 2025, Spoleto issued 500+ tickets to 28 partner organizations, including:
 - Allegro Charter School of Music, AMOR Healing Kitchen, Association for the Blind and Visually Impaired SC, Beyond Basic Life Skills, Canterbury House, Charleston Jewish Federation, Charleston Music Teacher Association, Charleston RISE, Charleston Stage, Creative Living, East Cooper Community Outreach, Flip League, Let's Walk, Lowcountry Food Bank, Media Reform SC, Mental Health Heroes, Metanoia, NXT Mission, Postpartum Support Charleston, Preservation Society of Charleston, St. Paul African Methodist Episcopal Church, Star Gospel Mission, The Beloved Early Education and Care Collective, The Family Resource Center for Disabilities and Special Needs, The Green Heart Project, The LENS Foundation, We Are Family, Wings for Kids
- Pay What You Will invites new audiences to set their own price for a variety of programs to make the Festival more accessible to those for whom ticket prices may be a barrier. In 2025, Spoleto sold tickets to over 26 programs and performances.

 Tell Your Story is a free program that pairs emerging composers with community partners to create sonic memoirs inspired by their memories and cultures. In 2025, Spoleto partnered with two local organizations, Charleston Jewish Federation and We Are Family, whose collaborative projects were shared with a live audience on May 29.



Spoleto Festival USA is partnering with Wolf Trap
Foundation for the Performing Arts to bring
customizable arts-based teaching and learning programs
to early childhood classrooms in Charleston, Berkeley,
and Dorchester counties. Through this collaboration,
known as Lowcountry South Carolina Wolf Trap,
Spoleto Festival USA has already trained four dedicated
teaching artists. These artists have successfully
completed 18 classroom residencies, directly enriching
the experience of over 200 Lowcountry students.

Our Community

- Spoleto conducts free Education Programs, including year-round classroom presentations, talks, and engagement opportunities for students of all ages with artists and staff. In 2025:
 - 341 students participated with 9 Festival artists.
 - 150 + students experienced in-school performances with Chamber Music artists.
 - 100 students attended workshops led by Festival artists.
 - 30 College of Charleston students attended performances and weekly lectures with Festival artists.
 - 30 teachers attended a creative education workshop and Festival performance.
 - 11 educational institutions partnered with Spoleto.
 - 2 Jazz Talks with curator Larry Blumenfeld and 4 Conversations With Emmy-winning CBS News correspondent Martha Teichner were hosted.
 - 2 talkbacks with the creative team of *Remember This: The Lesson of Jan Karski* were offered.







SPOLETO IN THE MEDIA

Spoleto Festival USA saw significant reach through earned media coverage and engagement across our social media platforms, including Instagram, Facebook, and LinkedIn where audience grew by 4,525 followers, with a 137% increase in reach and 71% increase in engagement.

Spoleto was featured in local, regional, and national news outlets in 160+ stories in 40 different publications, reaching 548 million+ readers.

Our Audience

The Festival drew a large and diverse audience for its 2025 celebration of performing arts.

- **48,000+** tickets issued
- 3,522 new ticket buyers
- 4,251 returning ticket buyers
- Audience came from 15 countries, 48 states, D.C., and Puerto Rico
- 60.6% are in metro Charleston
- **68.2%** are from South Carolina
- 86% are from the southeastern U.S.









■ In partnership with Beemok Hospitality Collection, we opened our 2025 Ticket Kiosk at The Charleston Place hotel. Guests were able to purchase tickets and merchandise from one of our box office agents, daily between May 19-June 8.
